The ABCs of MOBILITY

What is a long-term mobility for studies*?

A period (1 or 2 semesters) spent abroad within the framework of an international agreement between our university and the host university

Main characteristics:

- Students have access to all services without paying tuition fees to the foreign institution*
- Participants receive an expense contribution
- Full recognition of agreed academic activities (exams, thesis, etc.)

*'study' = courses and exams only; thesis only; courses and exams + thesis and/or work placement Note: it is not possible to go on an internship only

Note: thesis and work placement: it is necessary for Partners to admit exchange students to these activities + a contribution for other services may be required



The ABCs of MOBILITY

What are the characteristics of a bilateral agreement?

- It is signed at School or Faculty or Department level (one belonging to the University of Padova and one to the Partner University) or at University level
- It determines the characteristics of the flows: **who** can leave, to **study what, how many months** of mobility can be financed, etc.
- Each agreement provides for a certain number of places available

Agreement between the two universities -> activities that can be carried out during the mobility -> LEARNING AGREEMENT


The activities to be carried out during the stay and those to be recognised in the career upon return are stipulated in the *Learning Agreement*, which is a contract signed by the UNIPD supervisor, the foreign supervisor and the student.

The choice of the destination(s) has a concrete impact on the academic career.

a. Your **studies** (the educational aspect): choosing a destination that suits the study programme you are enrolled in

KNOWING THE STUDY PROGRAMME YOU ARE ENROLLED IN

During the mobility you can «match» (= substitute) the exams you are supposed to take during the year of Mobility

-> do you know which are the **mandatory exams** foreseen by your study plan?

They can be replaced by courses in the same field, but NOT all universities offer courses covering all fields

->E.G. Medical Biotechnologies students will carry their master's thesis abroad as well as Pharmaceutical Biotechnologies students.



HOW TO EVALUATE THE HOST UNIVERSITY EDUCATIONAL OFFER

Unipd's courses foreseen by your study plan ———— Available courses at the Host University

They must belong to the same study field/scope.

Consult the syllabus of the foreign Institution and make sure the content and the number of ECTS are similar.



a. Your **studies** (the educational aspect): choosing a destination that suits the study programme you are enrolled in

AVAILABLE COURSES AT THE HOST UNIVERSITY

Which are the available courses for **exchange students coming through that agreement**?

In which language are they taught?

What **restrictions** are imposed on exchange students?

What **structure** (faculty/department) is the agreement with?

Universities, regardless of what they offer, may offer exchange students pre-defined tracks, lists to choose from, the possibility of choosing courses only from one course of study...

Note: you can choose maximum 3 extra exams outside your year of enrollment in 25/26.

Note: it is impossible to be certain now of next year's course offer, but it is important to check the general availability of courses in the areas necessary for your own study path, also in order to fill in the mandatory application annex to the application as well as possible



Available courses at Hosts universities

The information available can be found in the agreements portal, under the section 'restrictions', but can also be found on the partners' websites, in the Fact Sheets and can be requested directly from them.

b. Language of study/requirements of the partners

Universities may also define requirements for exchange students, such as **a minimum number of credits** obtained prior to the exchange, **a certain average** or specific language requirements to be demonstrated with certain certificates.

It is the responsibility of the applicant to take these aspects into account and to meet the Partner's requirements by the application dates, i.e. by the time when, if selected, it will be necessary to enrol with Partners as exchange students.

WARNING: do not confuse the requirements for exchange students with those for international students enrolling on a full course of study



c. Cost of living - scholarship: how much it amounts to and when it is paid

Erasmus scholarship:

- two tranches: the first part about two months after the start of the mobility, the balance upon return.
- does not cover all expenses.

The cost of living can be very different depending on the country and city of destination



e. Organization of the academic year

Each country and each university has its own organisation in terms of the academic year, which often differs from that of Unipd.

Most are organised in **semesters**, and generally France and Northern Europe (not Germany) start the academic year in August. This means that you will probably miss an exam session in Padua or part of a term's lessons.

It is possible to take the exams once you return to the first available session. As everyone will have to re-organise the year in which they will go on mobility, it is important to bear this in mind when choosing where to go.

N.B: in most cases those who win a second call for applications can carry out their mobility starting from the second semester of the following academic year, due to the deadlines of the Partners



f. Personal needs related to credit registration

At the end of mobility the process of registering credits in the booklet can take up to a month, because it involves the work of several offices (partner university, which has to send the ToR, mobility unit, students careers office).

If you need to have the credits registered by a certain date for **financial benefits**, **accommodation** or **other personal needs** (e.g. enrolment in a Master's degree or PhD programme), this is something to bear in mind, in particular at what time the exam session at the Partner university takes place and, if the information is available, how long it takes for them to send Unipd the certificate of the exams taken.



h. Any visa requirement and possible renewal of residence permit

Students who are selected for a mobility period are responsible for the documents required to enter the host country.

For example, in the UK, a passport and visa are required, even if you are an Italian citizen. People with non-European citizenship, who study at Unipd with a residence permit, must also make sure that this does not expire during the mobility (postpone departure to the second semester if it expires between September and December) and ensure that they can return to Italy to complete their studies.



It is necessary:

- being full time students at the Partner University at least for 60 days (max 12 months per study cycle)
- that the period spent abroad is uninterrupted (periods of teaching activity are covered)
- obtaining at least 12 credits (at least 3 in the Study Plan)
- end the mobility by the 30 September 2026

The possibility of carrying out the period abroad for selected students is **always subject to acceptance by the host foreign institution** and, where applicable, the issuing of a visa by the country of destination.



To be admitted to the call it is necessary:

- Being regularly enrolled in the second year of Medicine and Surgery degree programme or the first year of a Master's degree
- Being up to date with fees payments
- Students enrolled in Medicine and Surgery: 40 credits registered at the moment in which they apply
- For first-year Master's students applying for the second call, have registered at least 15 CFUs at the time of application (and 40 before the departure)

Do not simultaneously take advantage of other EU-funded scholarships for the same study period abroad for the academic year 2025/2026.

First call

- The application deadline is the same for ALL the calls
- On 17/02/2025 the ranking lists of all the Calls (Erasmus, Ulisse, SEMP) will be published and the 1° window to accept the place is open. At this time you choose which Erasmus destination to accept in case you win more than one call for applications
- Only one Erasmus+ mobility can be accepted, while Erasmus+, Ulisses and SEMP mobility can be accepted and carried out as long as the periods do not overlap.
- The procedure to accept the place is described here.
- On 03/03/2025, updated departmental Erasmus+ destinations rankings will be published; the updated Erasmus+ rankings will not contain the data of students who have accepted/rejected an Erasmus+ mobility place during the first window accept the place.
- The second window to accept the place is only open for the Erasmus+ call for departmental destinations

- Only one Erasmus+ mobility can be accepted, while an Erasmus+ and an Ulisses mobilities can be accepted and carried out as long as the periods do not overlap.
- The procedure to accept the place is described here.
- On 20/05/2025, updated departmental Erasmus+ destinations rankings will be published; the updated Erasmus+ rankings will not contain the data of students who have accepted/rejected an Erasmus+ mobility place during the first window accept the place.
- The second window to accept the place is only open for the Erasmus+ call for departmental destinations

CHOOSE WISELY EACH DESTINATION!



When applying for Erasmus+ for studies, you can choose up to 2 destinations sorted by priority.

All the candidate's options are considered for the ranking of each relevant destination, which is sorted by score.

Winners are declared as such and assigned to only 1 destination per call.

Priority is taken into account when a candidate results among the winners in more than one ranking.

University and School of Medicine criteria – language knowledge - max 30 points

The certifications taken into consideration for the purpose of calculating the score are the following ones:

- Certifications listed in the following link: https://cla.unipd.it/testlinguistici/certificazioni/
- Certificates issued by the Centro Linguistico di Ateneo (the university language center) after having undertaken a test. The languages offered include English, French, Spanish, and German, and proficiency levels available are either B1 or B2. The assessable skills include reading and listening.

It's important to note that the test can be taken only once. A test session is scheduled for the beginning of January 2025 (15/16 January) for students intending to apply in the 1st call for the academic year 25/26.

Registrations opened December 1 and will close on January 9th, 2025.

- titles of the courses reported NOT in the teaching language
- subjects not delivered by the Host University
- entire Bachelor's/Master's programmes and not subjects at Partners University
- UNIPD courses
- Blank/ not filled out document
- The courses listed in Appendix 1 are not binding even in the event being selected
- If you apply for more than one destination, a list of activities must be completed for each destination. If not completed for one of your chosen destinations, you will be NOT eligible for that destination.
- Annex 1a is to be completed in the case of mobility for thesis or if you also intend to carry out an internship (except for nursing) and must be signed by the lecturer responsible for each destination*teaching refers to individual subjects


